Half the across and half the down clues contain a misprint of one letter in each, always occurring in the definition part. Their answers should be entered correctly spelt. Remaining answers are to be entered with a misprint of one letter only in each, always checked. In the clues to each of these the definition refers to the untreated answer and the subsidiary indication refers to the misprinted form to be entered. The misprints appearing in the finished diagram, taken in clue order, acrosses then downs, form a non-dictionary compound that could be regarded as a fanciful definition of MISPRINTS.
