
Azed No. 2,443 'Printer's Devilry' - Competition Puzzle

Each clue, except **1Across**, is a passage from which the printer has removed a hidden answer, closing the gap and sometimes taking liberties with the punctuation, but not disturbing the order of the remaining letters. **Example:** Vaulting above tunnel entrance appears inane, scary. **Answer:** PESTO. **Undevilled version:** Vaulting above tunnel entrance appears in an *escape story*. Every passage, when complete, makes

reasonable sense. Competitors should submit with their entries a 'PD' clue to replace the asterisked definition at **1 Across. NB** Preference is given to PD clues in which breaks before and after the word omitted (before and after omission) do not occur ant the ends or beginnings of words in the clue. **Please give the full undevilled version of your clue as well as the clue itself.**
